'CLIMATE JUSTICE' IS THE TERM WE USE TO REFER TO IMPLICATIONS OF CLIMATE CHANGE THAT ARE



IT BEGINS WITH RECOGNISING THAT DIFFERENT GROUPS OF PEOPLE ARE AFFECTED DIFFERENTLY BY CLIMATE CHANGE.

A community's ability to prevent and survive the negative consequences of climate change is shaped by factors such as:



FOR EXAMPLE, SOMEONE LIVING IN A POORER COMMUNITY, RURAL AREA OR TOWNSHIP WILL BE LESS ABLE TO COPE WITH DROUGHT, FLASH FLOODS AND HEAT WAVES THAN SOMEONE WHO LIVES IN A WEALTHY AREA.
